SPEAKERS CORNER

On October 3 our speaker Sylvia Cook, accompanied by her husband Steve Cavalier, made a very interesting presentation about their rammed earth home located in Castleton. Sylvia was totally passionate about building a completely eco-friendly, sustainable house. She said that since nearly 1/2 of the world's population live in dirt houses this really is not an unusual choice. The construction of this house is very much healthier than our conventional methods. There is no chance of dry rot or mold and there have been no studs smothered with insecticide. The outside walls are constructed with a centre of insulation flanked by rammed earth supported by rebar. There is also a interior wall, 20 feet high, made of rammed earth without insulation. The windows are placed to allow the sunlight to shine on this wall as well as the outside walls in order to heat the building. They do not need a furnace or air conditioner to keep the house comfortable winter and summer. People from as far away as Montreal and Kitchener have come to open house functions at their home. It has also been featured in the Globe and Mail as well as the web magazine, BEC Green.

Sylvia and Steve have formed a company, Aerecura, to promote the building of rammed earth homes.

It was decided that we as a club will set up a date to tour Sylvia and Steve's home later this fall.

On October 17 our speaker was Daphne Simms, a retired secondary school teacher who spoke about her charity *Change for Charange*. Daphne started this charity after several trips to Nepal. She witnessed the appalling conditions suffered by the lower caste people of that area. There is very delayed development in the entire country. Half the population of the country is below the age of 21 and although education is officially free, this is really not the case. There are funding shortfalls and access to the existing schools is very limited. These schools are very primitive and over-crowded. Her guide while trekking the Anapura Circuit showed her a picture of the school in his village. It had a mud floor and few supplies. Very few teachers are properly trained and of those who are, the turn-over is alarming. Daphne felt it was important to expand access to education for the children in the lower castes. She began in the area of Dhading with the Sante Kali Primary School. It initially had 40 primary and 15 secondary students. They first improved the school building and then built a new school. It has 6 classrooms and room for 300 students. In 2009 they began a pre-primary program for kindergarten and grade one children. A bonus now is that adults - mostly women - are using the school building in the evenings to further their education.

Daphne has enlisted the help of the students from ENSS to fund raise. So far they have contributed \$8000. \$48 covers fees, uniforms, books and supplies for one child for one year.
