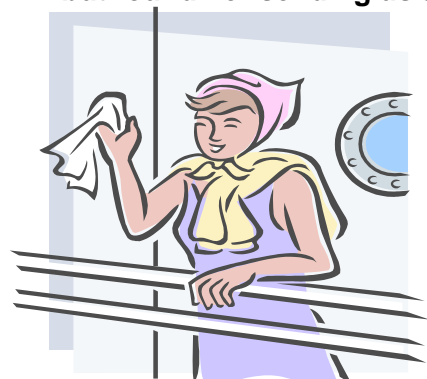
Club Started July 1998

Wendy Kolodziejczak, Project Manager and Gayle Einarsson, Patient advocate gave an impressive presentation on

P A T H

Partners Advancing Transitions in Healthcare, a first with Ontario patients: Northumberland County.

PATH is the centerpiece of the The Change Foundation's strategic plan. The foundation is putting most of the money (\$3 million dollars and two years' work into PATH to deliver the plan's goal "To improve people's healthcare experience as they move in and out of and across Ontario's healthcare system over time", This project is the largest and most ambitious to date by the Foundation.

The PATH project was chosen according to the CEO's Cathy Fookes, the Change Foundation from 27 submissions, short listed to five because in her words "Northumberland showed the smarts, the heart, the team, and the experience to set PATH up for success."

Northumberland County has a large concentration with chronic health conditions.

Northumberland PATH is the first system-wide patient/caregiver/provider co-design venture in Ontario. Wendy described the Northumberland community Partnership, led by Northumberland Hills Hospital, units of 12 health, social care and patient advocacy organizations, Gayle described her personal interest in the project because she was the care giver for elderly parents and was also committed to change for the better.

Wendy explained that phase one was done and the phase two pilot was just beginning whereby project teams test out solutions on a small scale, refine ideas and then re-test.

Promising solutions will be tested on a larger scale with seniors in the Community.

Phase 3 The Northumberland Community Partnership and the Change Foundation evaluate and share what is

learned to improve healthcare across Ontario.
