To wind up the Scottish theme Harry Nash delighted the assembly by reading *"The Effen Bee"*, lyrics by Matt McGinn, about a beekeeper from the wee Scottish town of Effen.

The guest speaker **Ken Prue**, founder of Northumberland Film Sundays and now owner-operator of the *Loft Cinema* in Cobourg, was introduced by *Michael Hanlon*. Ken started his discourse with a brief biography, highlighting his love of film and experience in the industry. The Loft Cinema, located above the *Harden & Huyse Cafe* at 201 Division St, is an intimate 60-seat theatre with a focus on the arts, documentaries and classic film. 
SOCIAL CALENDAR
